

We were delighted to honor the **Rotary Club of Natomas** for completing a lead paint abatement project during the pandemic. If you've driven by Stanford Settlement Neighborhood Center lately, you've seen the bright, clean fresh paint on our buildings.

You may also notice some shiny new windows, along with an electric vehicle charging station and TWO new electric vehicles, thanks to the generosity of **SMUD**!

Finally, we recognized the generosity of City **Councilmember Jeff Harris** who has been steadfast in his support of Stanford Settlement Neighborhood Center during his past eight years in office. His many contributions have helped the agency survive – and thrive – before, during, and after the pandemic.

The **Leadership Sacramento Class of 2022** is forging ahead with their project which will improve the outdoor space at the Senior Center. The space has been graded and new concrete walkways are in place. The seniors are looking forward to taking some of their activities outdoors this spring!

Looking ahead, we are gearing up for Operation Cratchit this month. We anticipate serving around 775 households again this holiday season. Students from **Jesuit High School** will provide thousands of pounds of non-perishable food again this year. Many groups and individuals are organizing toy drives, including the **Gardenland Northgate Neighborhood Association**, the **Sacramento Hotel Association**, **International Association of Machinists Local #946**, and the students of **St. Francis High School**. In addition to food, toys, and gifts, we are also accepting donations of wrapping paper. If you are interested in volunteering, give us a call!

Recently we welcomed several groups of students and faculty from **Jesuit High School** to help out in the Senior Center. Also, employees from **California Bank & Trust** spent a day organizing nonperishable food items and serving lunch to the seniors at the Senior Center. And last month employees from **Turner Construction Company** donated their time and expertise to make improvements around the agency. Thank you to everyone who volunteers!


